


## VLC Download Guide-Mac

1.) Open a Web Browser and navigate to the following link:

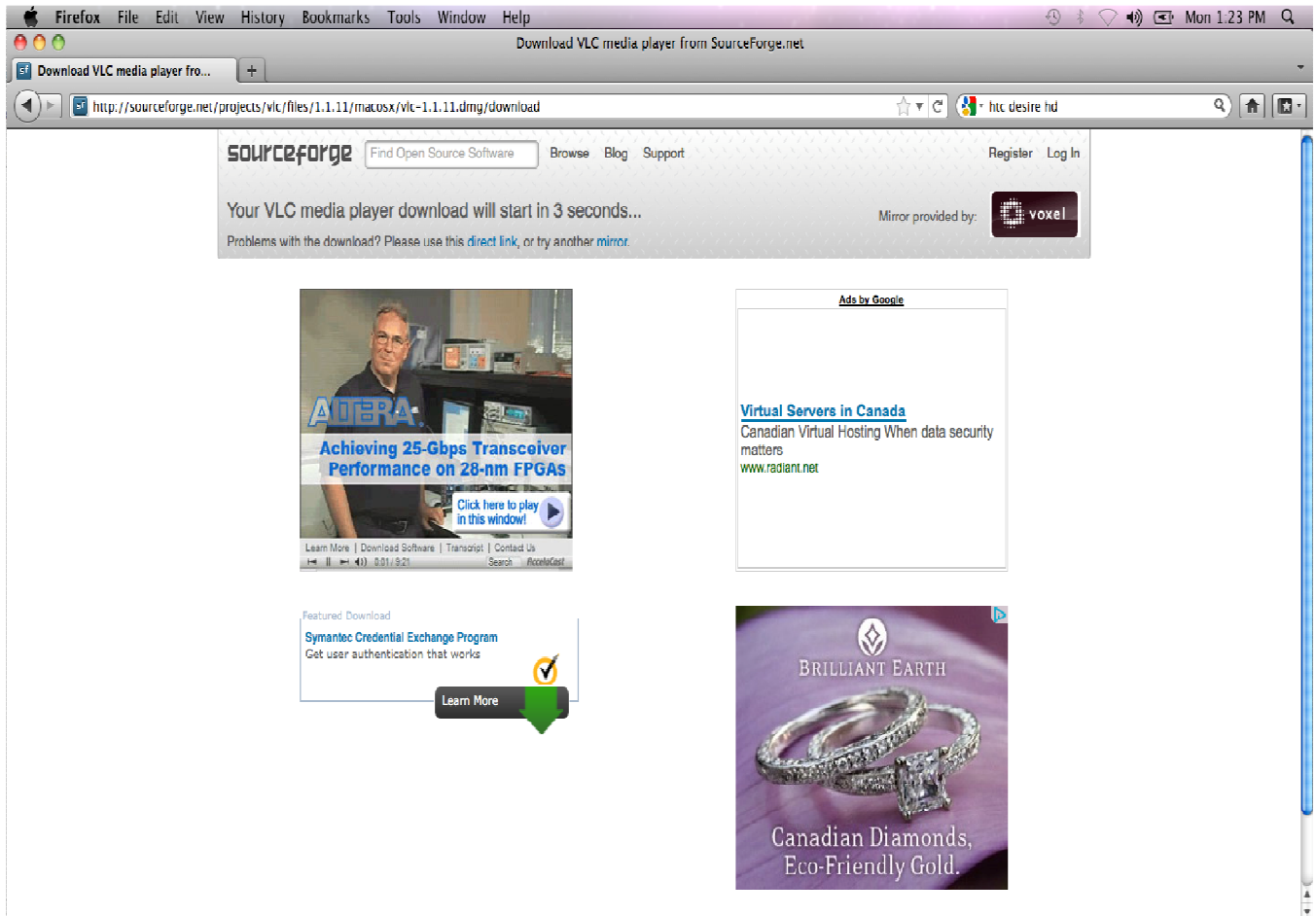

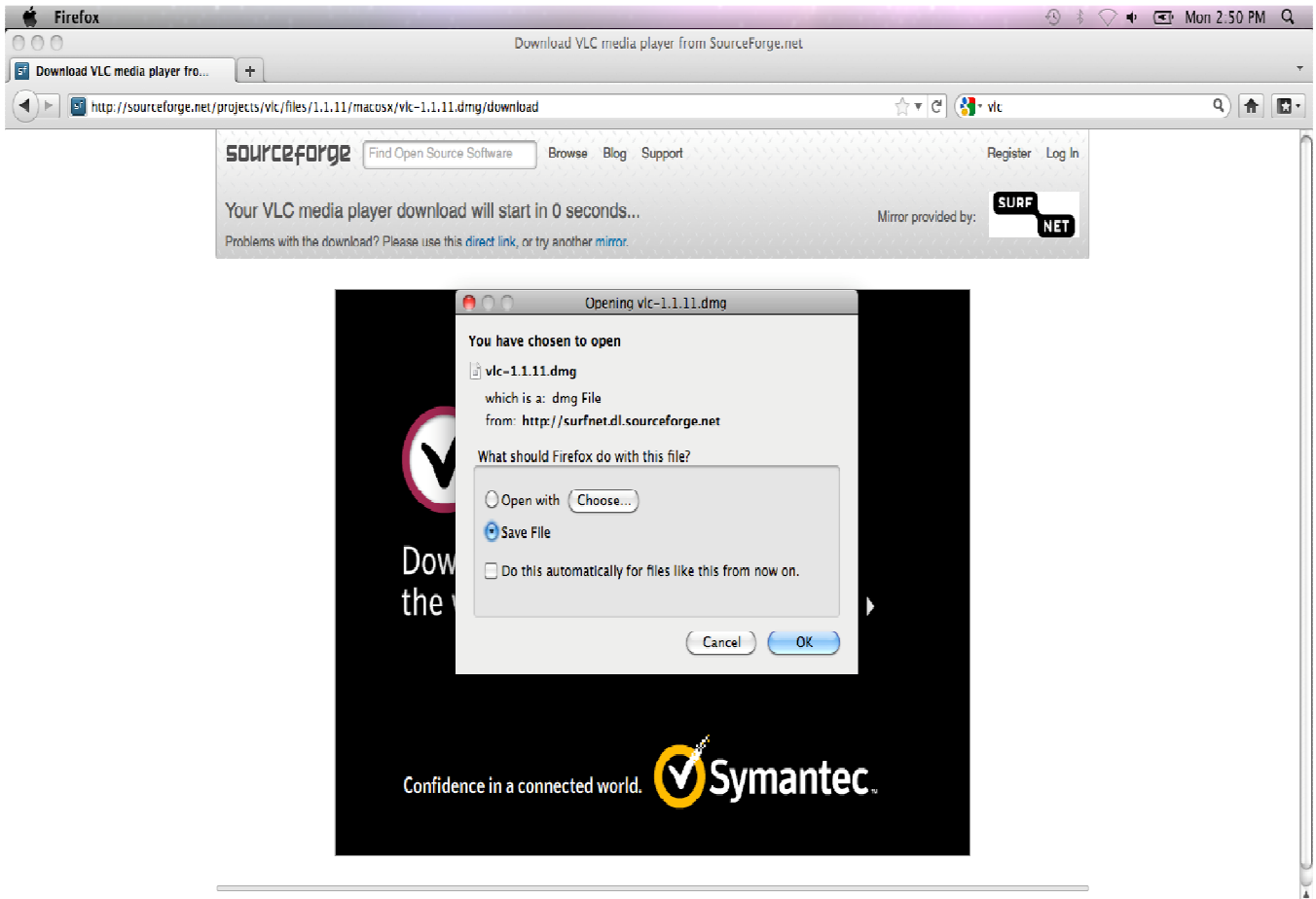

Click "Download VLC"

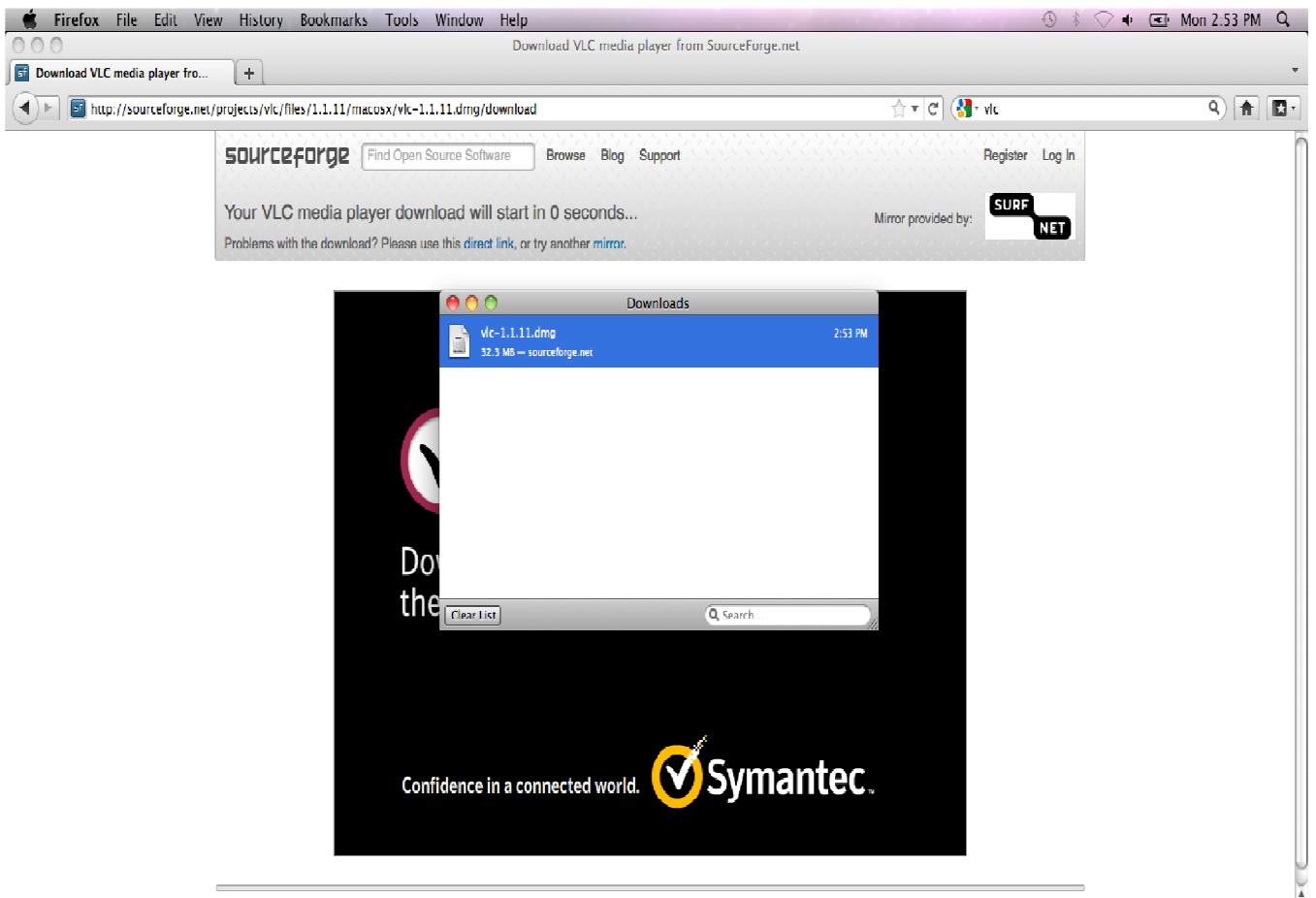
2.) You will be brought to a screen similar to the one below.



3.) After waiting the required 5 seconds, a dialog box will open. In this box click “Save File.”



4.)After clicking “Ok” a Download Box will appear with the VLC installer. Double click on the VLC Download Box.

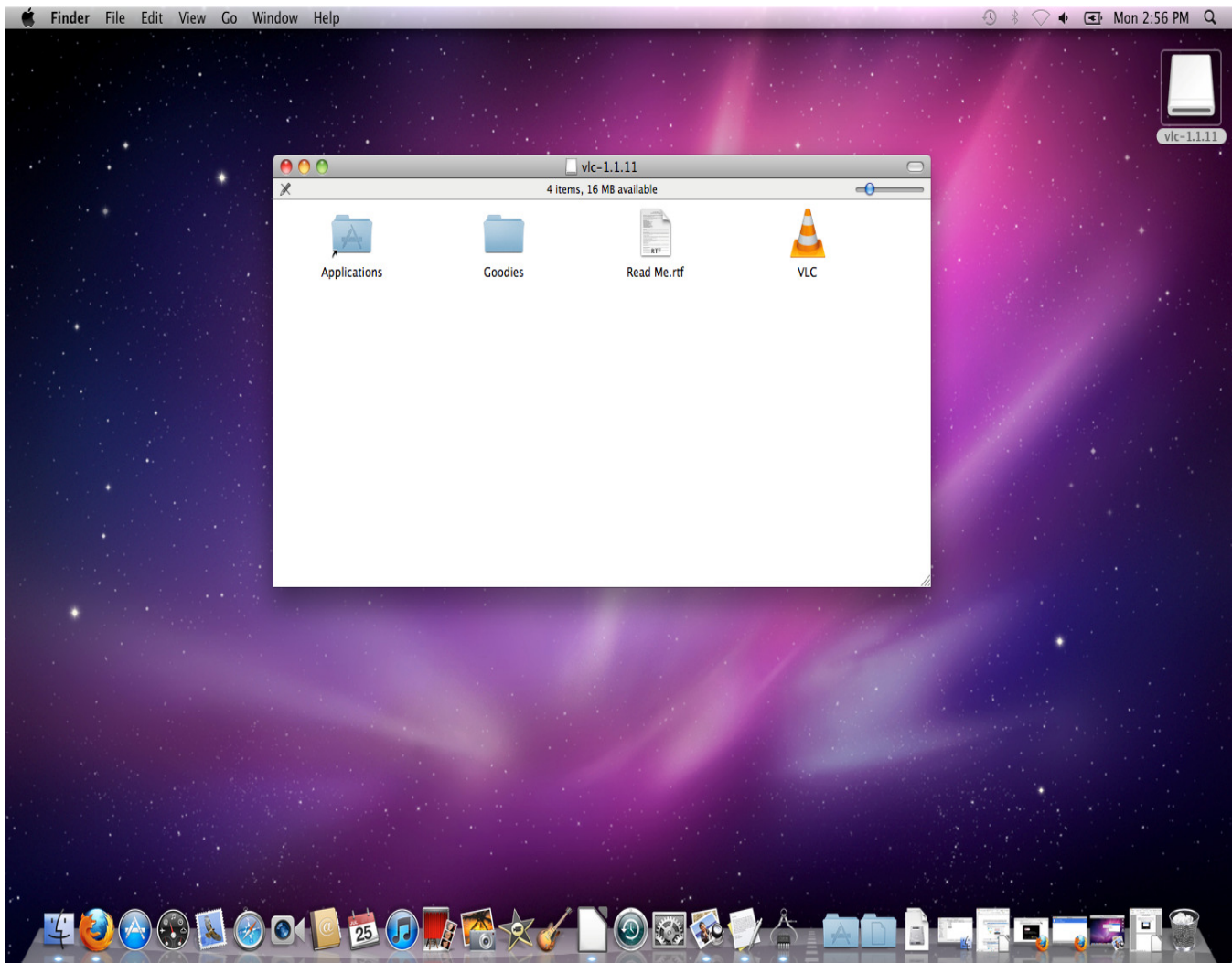


5.) Following download completion, an icon will appear on the desktop similar to the one below.



Double click on the new icon that should be labelled “vlc-1.1.11” or something similar.

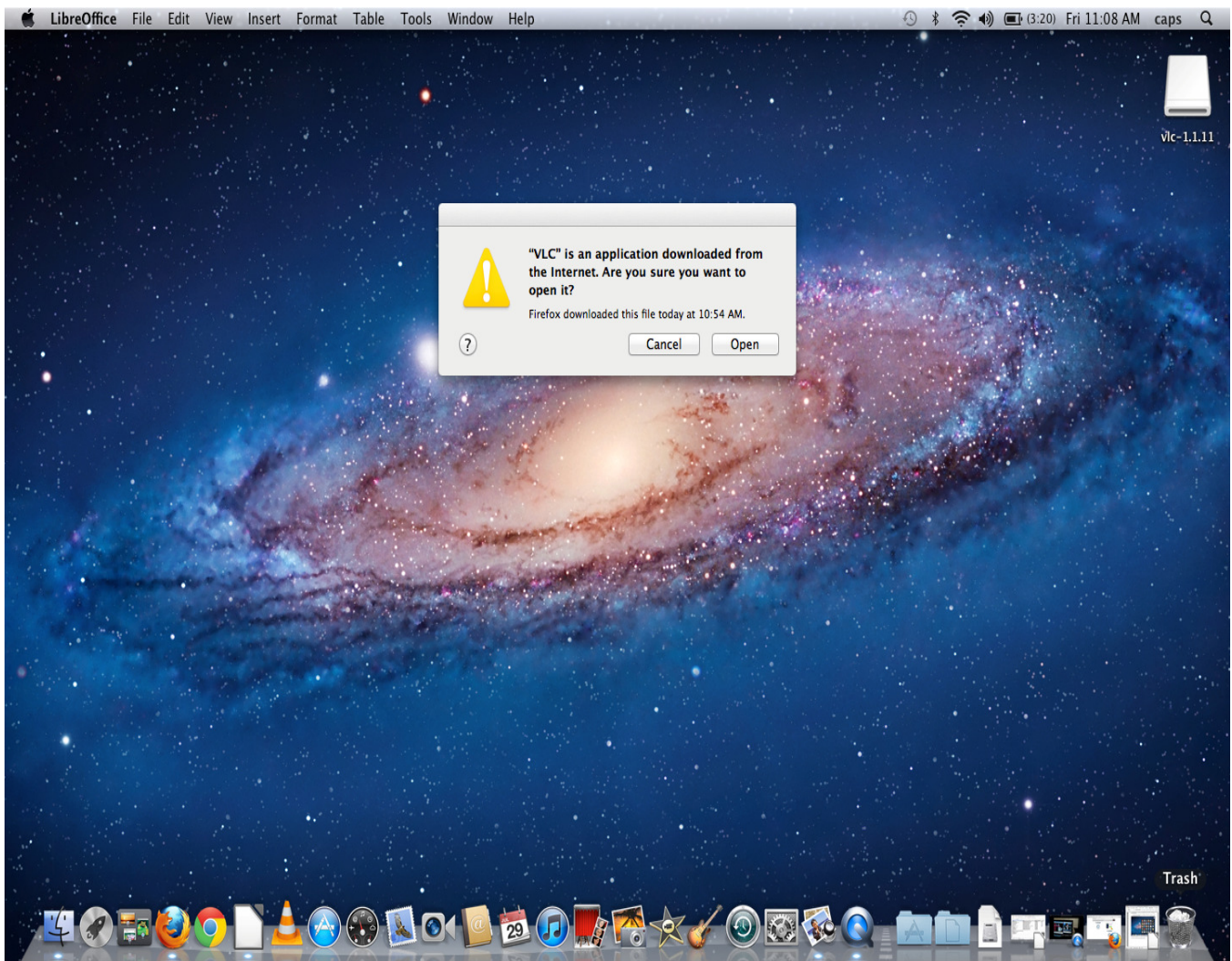
6.) After opening the “vlc-1.1.11” icon, a box similar to the one below will appear.



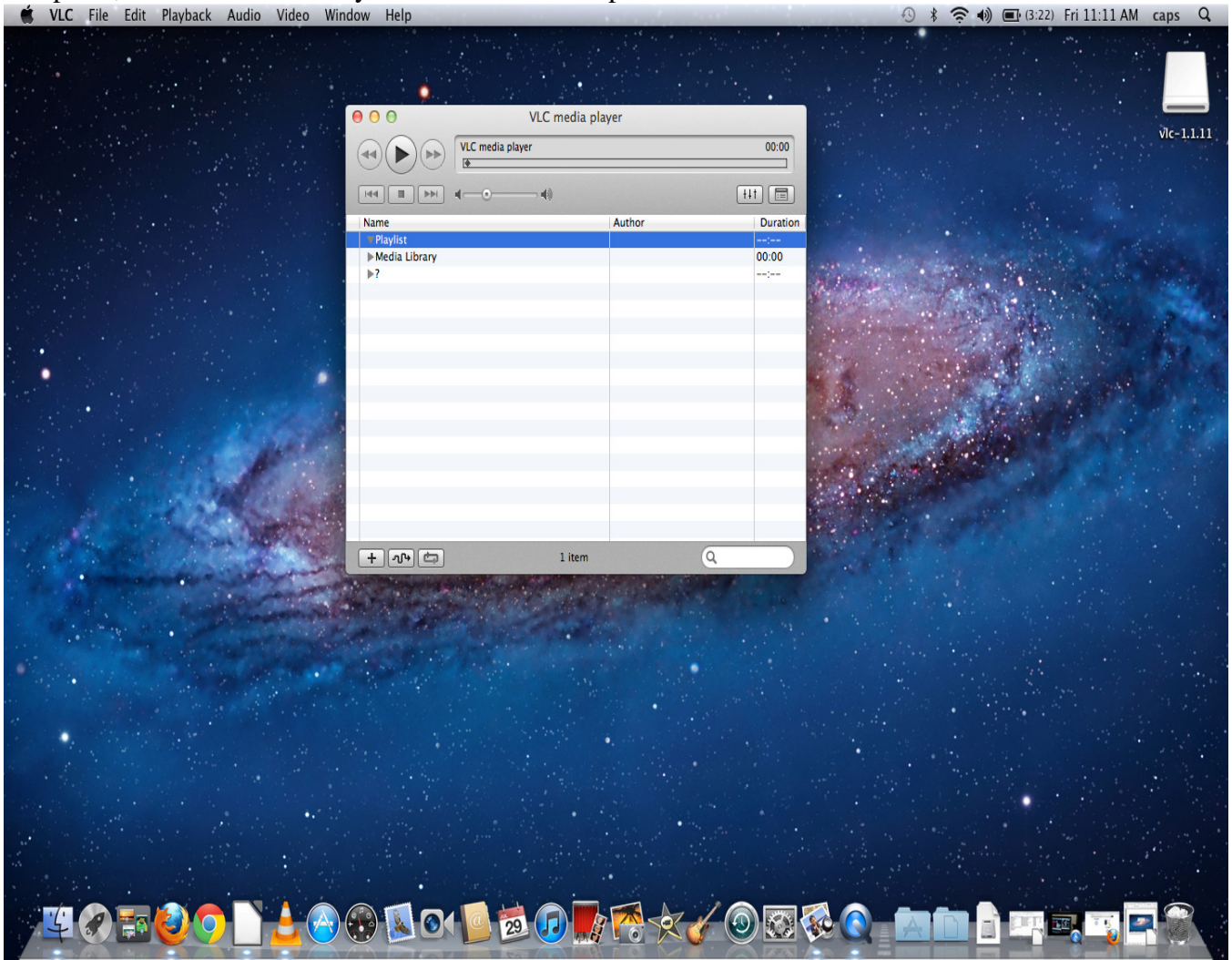
At this screen, drag the “VLC” pylon into the “Applications” folder. This will add VLC Media Player to your applications list.



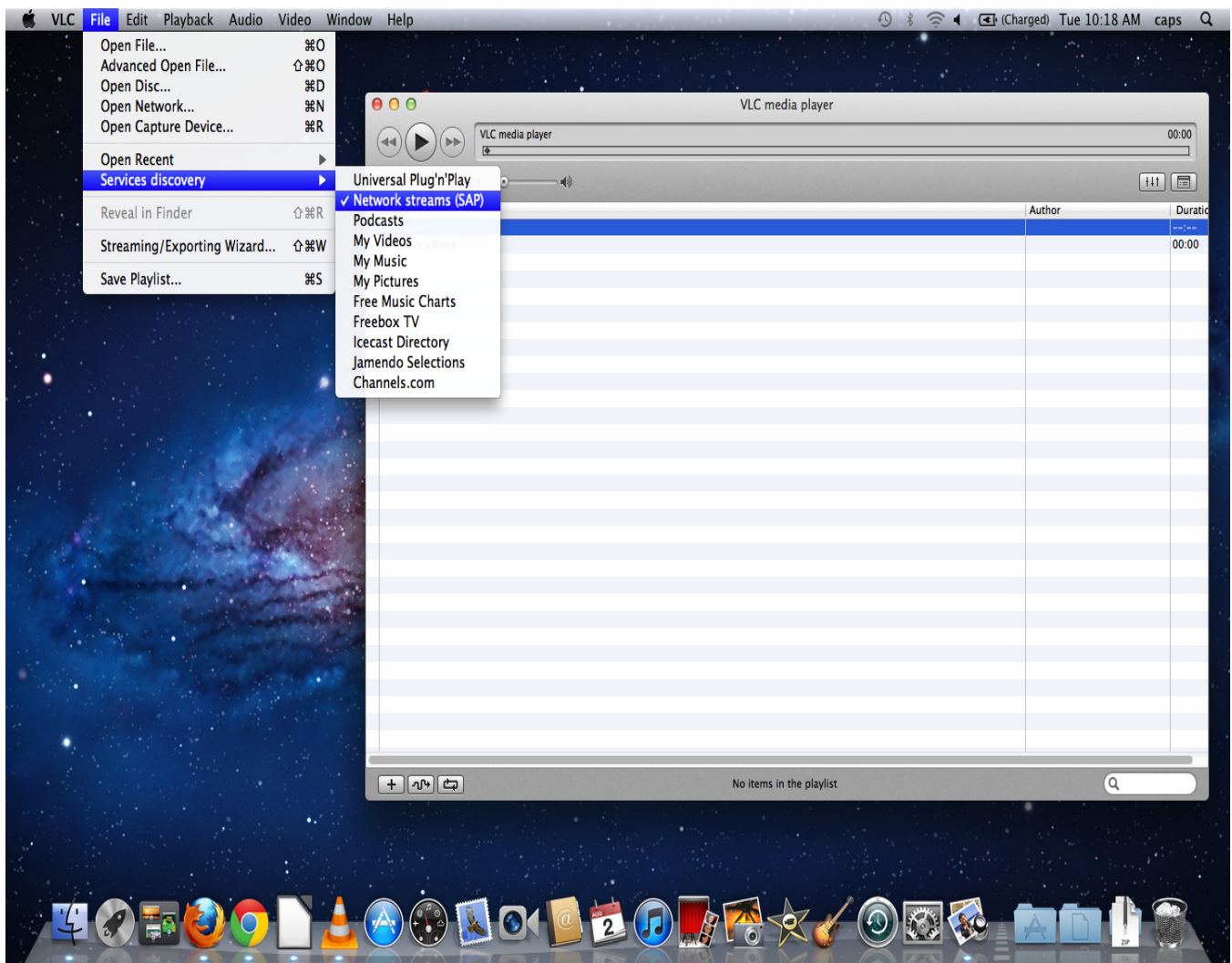
- 7.) At this point, VLC should appear in your “Applications” folder. Open the “Applications” folder and scroll until you see “VLC.” At this point, click and drag the “VLC” icon into the Dock. This will add VLC to the Mac Dock. Click the “VLC” pylon to initiate application permissions.



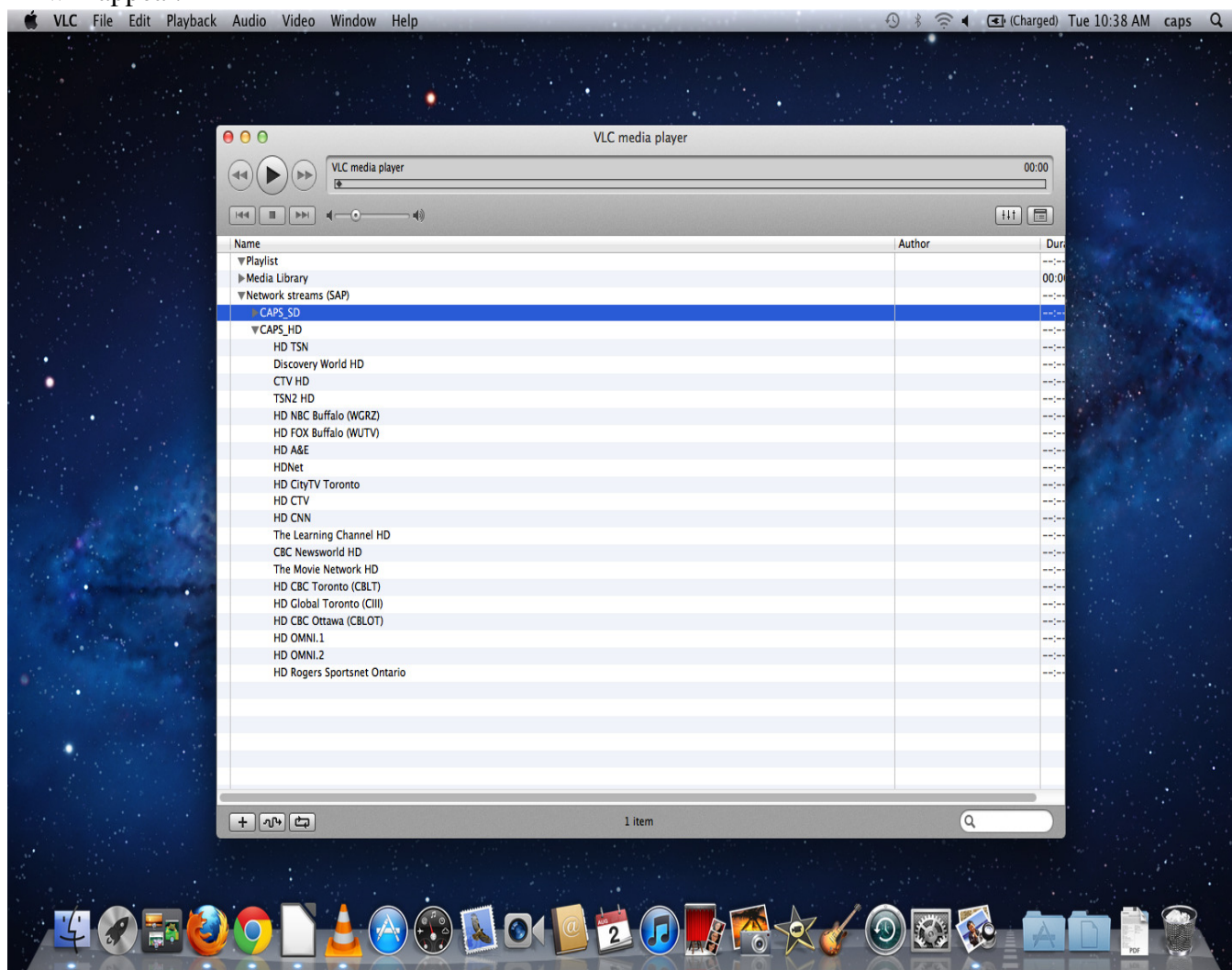
8.) A box will appear similar to the one above asking if you would like to open “VLC” click “Open” At this point, the VLC Media Player interface should open.



9.) At this point, you can begin to setup the PNPTV streaming. Connect an ethernet cable to your computer and from the VLC menu, click “File” then scroll to “Series Discovery” and then select “Network Streams (SAP).”



10.) Now, the PNPTV stream will appear in the VLC playlist screen. You are now able to start viewing PNPTV content. Click the “Down” arrow found beside the title “Network Streams (SAP).” Here you will find a list of both “HD” and “SD” streams. When the streams are open, a list of available channels will appear.



11.)To view a channel, simply double click the channel you would like to watch. Here, we have selected “CBC Newsworld HD.” Standard controls are found at the bottom of the screen. Selecting the double arrows (forward or back) will scan to the next or previous channel in the playlist.



12.) Finally, to ensure the best playback quality is achieved, we must activate VLC's built in "Deinterlacer". To do this, from the top menu, select "Video" then "Deinterlace" then "On."



13.) Now, we will select the Deinterlace mode that will best suit your viewing needs. Again, from the top menu select “Video” then “Deinterlace mode” then “Blend.” You are now ready to enjoy PNPTV.
